OSHA 300 Log of Work-Related Fatalities, Injuries and Illness: 29 CFR 1904.0 – the OSHA 300 Log must be maintained by employers unless there is an exemption, based on the NAICS code or the size of the employer.

The Temporary rule addressing the COVID-19 emergency in employer-provided housing, labor-intensive agricultural operations, and agricultural transportation was set to expire on October 24, 2020. On October 23, 2020 Governor Brown issued an Executive Order (20-58) extending the requirements of employer-provided housing (Section 2) of the Temporary Rule.

Most employers with 10 or fewer employees, or in low risk industries identified by OSHA, are exempt from these recordkeeping requirements, unless instructed otherwise by the government. For employers that are not exempt from these recordkeeping requirements, OSHA has issued enforcement guidance on when to record an employee's COVID-19 illness.
