The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved several kinds of medications for ADHD that include stimulants (methylphenidate-based and amphetamine-based products) and nonstimulants including atomoxetine and antihypertensives (alpha-2 adrenergic agonists). These medications are listed in the chart below which shows:

Medications Used in the Treatment of ADHD - CHADD

In terms of non-stimulant medications, ADHD specialists recommend using atomoxetine (Strattera) as a first choice in children and adults, followed by guanfacine or clonidine in children, or bupropion or nortriptyline in adults.

Atomoxetine (Strattera) can be effective for treating ADHD. It works by a different chemical mechanism than stimulants. Atomoxetine is relatively safe, but carries a rare risk of liver toxicity. The antidepressant, bupropion (Wellbutrin), is helpful in some cases.
